Classes for Next Year

At this time of year, the staff and I are starting to sort out the arrangements for next year's classes, so I thought I would take this opportunity to explain the process to parents and carers. As I am sure you appreciate, this is a very complicated procedure and we put a lot of thought into the groupings and the make-up of each class.

We make sure all children have several children from their current class in their new class so that they have familiar faces in September, and they will all visit their new class twice before the end of term. In addition to this we ask the children to complete "Friendship Stars" so that they have some say in who they would like to be with.

The children will bring home a star today to fill in with the names of 5 friends they would like to be with next year. Please warn your child that they will not be with all 5 of these friends, but they will be with at least one of them. Please make sure that your child chooses friends from the <u>same year group</u>, although they don't have to all be from their current class. Please do not 'number' the friends on the stars as we are not able to guarantee which of the friends your child will be with.

We have also sent "Friendship Stars" to our Y2 children because the Junior School ask us to help set up the classes for next year's Y3. We do liaise with Holy Trinity School, but as you can imagine this can get very complicated, so if Y2 children have friends from Holy Trinity School they can write these as 'extras' on the sheet and we will try to take them into consideration.

All stars need to be returned to the office by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>4 June</u> (the day we return after the half term holiday).

Finally, please will parents and carers make sure their child's sweatshirts and jumpers are clearly labelled with their name – the children are obviously taking them off in this warm weather and the lost property box is getting very full!
