### Y2 Residential Visits – Red Room

A reminder that on Friday, Red Room are going on their residential visit to Sherwood Forest. Please find below some information about the visit, (your child will have also brought home a kit list today).

- Your child needs a small suitcase containing nightclothes, washbag, spare clothes, a teddy, a small toy and a book. (Please avoid electrical and noisy toys to avoid disturbing sleepy room-mates!)
- They need a separate backpack containing spending money (£8 maximum), a refillable water bottle, snacks, and Friday's packed lunch (if you have ordered a school packed lunch this will be given out on Friday morning, but your child will still need their water bottle and snacks). All other meals are provided by the Youth Hostel.
- They may bring a camera if they wish to, (but not a phone or any other smart device which can connect to the internet or send messages).
- Any medication **MUST** be handed in to the Office on Friday morning.
- I will update you over the weekend by the text system, and also put some pictures on Facebook
- On Saturday the children need to be collected from the School Hall between **1pm & 1.30pm**. I will send a text when we leave the youth hostel to give you a more accurate arrival time. By all means "meet and greet" the bus, but then please let everyone walk back up to the Hall to allow staff to give out any belongings and pass on any messages.
- Please let us know on Friday morning if your child is being picked up by anyone else on Saturday.



### "Bee Day" – Monday, 8 July

A reminder that on Monday, 8 July it is "Bee Day"! The children may come to school in black and yellow or orange clothing, bee costumes, and bee accessories (not school uniform). The day will be spent researching about bees, doing bee crafts, exploring the outside area, and much more.
