

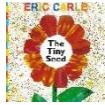

Enquiry Theme - How does your garden grow?



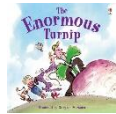
Understanding the World

- Know how to explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants.



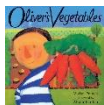
The Tiny Seed

Plants grow from seeds. They need water, light and food to grow. Plants need care to grow in a healthy way.



The Enormous Turnip

Plants change as they grow, some get taller and some wider. Most plants are green in colour. Some vegetables, like turnips and carrots grow under the ground.



Oliver's Vegetables

Lots of different fruits and vegetables can be grown in a garden. In our school grounds there are also lots of different plants growing. We can use our senses to explore these and talk about what we can see, hear and feel when we are outside.

Key vocabulary

Grow	A change to an object. The object usually gets bigger.
Seeds	The part of a plant which can grow into a new plant.
Soil	A brown material that seeds and plants can grow in.
Water	A clear liquid that plants need to live.
Warm	An increase in temperature which helps plants to grow.
Roots	The part of the plant underground that helps take up water and food.
Vegetables	A plant or part of a plant used as food.
Yayoi Kusama	A Japanese Artist who creates her work from dots! She creates artwork that looks like fruit and vegetables.
