- Know what is meant by describing Moses as a great leader for the Jewish people, giving examples of his leadership.
- Know that Christian and Jewish people believe Moses was guided by God and given wisdom by God.
- Know the qualities that Moses had that made him a great leader.
- Know that Christian and Jewish people believed that the Ten Commandments were rules for living harmoniously.
- Know that leaders can say some wise things.
- Know how to ask questions about leadership and suggest answers.
- Know an example of a great leader, religious or non-religious.

History

- Know that Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King are significant people in history.
- Know what Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King did, and how their actions can make them be seen as leaders.
- Know that the time when Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King lived had differences and similarities to today, and make these connections.
- Know how Rosa Parks's and Martin Luther King's actions can be seen as inspirational.

Key Vocabulary

Old Testament – The first part of the Christian holy book: The Bible. It was written before the birth of Jesus and includes stories that teach Christians about God and how to live their lives.

The Ten Commandments – A set of biblical rules given to Moses by God. They are the rules that Christian and Jewish people try to follow to enable them to live harmoniously with each other.

Leader – A person who inspires and motivates people to achieve a goal.

Human rights - The basic rights and freedoms that belong to every person in the world. They apply regardless of where you are from, what you believe or how you choose to live your life.

Moses – In the Bible and the Torah we learn about Moses. God gave Moses the ability to lead his people out of slavery and into freedom.

Before – At an earlier time **After** – In the time following **Then** – At that time.

Now – At the present time or moment.

Timeline – A graphical representation of a period of time, on which important events are marked.

Chronology – The arrangement of dates and times in order of when they happened.

Empathy – The ability to share and understand feelings of another.

Important – Of great significance or value.

Event – Something that happens or takes place, especially one of importance.

Order – The arrangement of people or things, usually in a sequence.
