



What is the FSA?

The Friends of the School Association (FSA) is a group of parents & carers and staff, who organise a range of activities and events throughout the school year to raise money and build a sense of community between pupils, parents & carers, and staff.

What sort of activities and events do the FSA put on?

The FSA tries to organise something for everyone, we run events such as:-

- Quiz Nights
- New and Pre-Loved Uniform Sales
- Leaver's T-Shirts
- School Discos (Y1 & Y2)
- Holiday activities including colouring competitions, trails, and quizzes
- Christmas Card Project and Grandparents Raffle towards the Children's Christmas Party

How is the money we raise spent?

The funds raised by the FSA enable us to provide things for the school that the children would otherwise perhaps not have. Funding requests may be put forward by the staff or the FSA committee, but mostly projects are identified by the children themselves!

Recent projects funded by the money raised include:-

- Additional reading books
- Contributing towards school visits
- Contributing towards the cost of Mr Thorpe's Christmas display

The FSA are currently raising funds for bike and scooter storage units.
